

## How to sew cushion kits from GypsyBoudoirMiniatures

This is a simple tutorial on how to sew cushion kits from GypsyBoudoirMiniatures made by Annie Fryd Christensen. Have fun!



This is the things needed when you are going to sew the cushions: scissors, small sewing needle, pin, thread and something to use for “stuffing”.

I prefer to use something heavy as stuffing because it gives a more natural look when you arrange the cushions in your miniature scenes. I use sometimes rice, couscous or sand, but here I have used a fine grained bulgur.



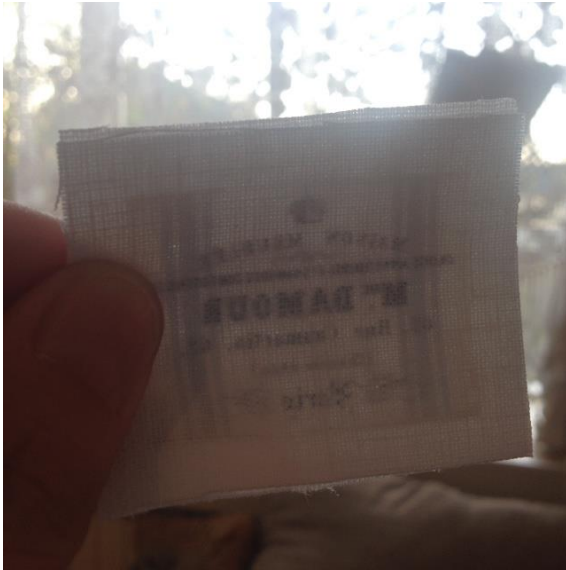
Carefully peel off the paper from the back of the printed fabric.

Note that the print is not waterproof!

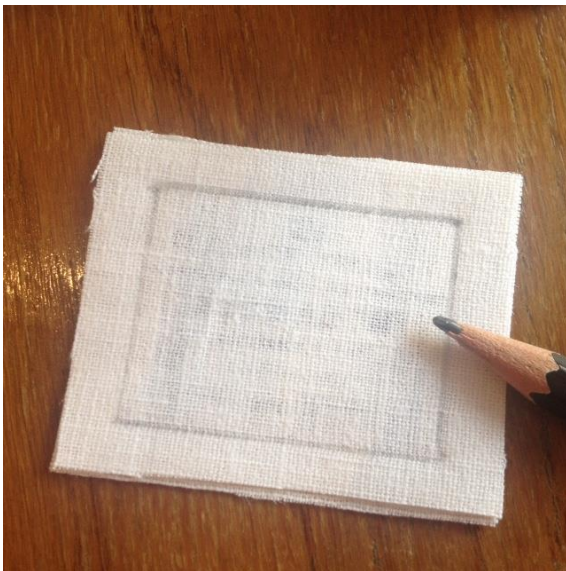


Now place the two pieces together, remember that the printed motif is turned inside.

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The two pieces are held together, and to be sure that you make the hem along the motif, it might be helpful to hold the fabric pieces up against a window to see the lines and maybe draw them carefully with a pencil.



Here the lines are drawn.



Now stitch along the lines. There is no right way to sew as long as you are aware that the stitches are tiny. Start at the bottom line and remember to keep an opening where you don't stitch, because you need to be able to turn the cushion inside out and fill it.

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Now the cushion is stitched all the way around except from the opening at the bottom. Cut off some of the excess fabric and the corners to avoid the fabric to bulk when it is turned and finished. I leave an edge approximately 4-5 mm.

Then turn it carefully inside out.



I use the scissor to push the corners very carefully and then I use a small pin to pull carefully the rest in place.



Then it's time to fill the cushion. Don't fill it too much as it will be too stuffed and uncomfortable for your dolls.

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Finally stitch the opening together. Maybe you have to do a little more adjustments to the corners with your pin.

Enjoy arranging the cushions in your dollhouse.
